1. This state was admitted to the union in 1845 as the 27th state. Tallahassee is its capitol. Its state bird is the Mockingbird. It is also known for its delicious grapefruits and oranges. Which state is it?



2. Admitted to the Union in 1792 as the 15th state, the official state flower is the Goldenrod. Its capitol city is Frankfort. Its state motto is "United we stand, divided we fall." Which state are we describing?



3. This Northeastern state is known for being involved in the early whaling industry. It was home to the first Catholic US president. Admitted to the Union in 1788, it sports the well known ports of Boston and New Bedford.



4. This state's first colony settlement disappeared in 1590. The state, founded in 1789, boasted the largest tobacco production in America for many years. Its capitol is Raleigh, and its state bird is the Cardinal. Which state is it?



5. This western state is known as "the Big Sky State." Its capital is Helena, and the Western Meadowlark the state bird. It is known for its protected wilderness, round ups and rodeos, and being an early mining entity.



6. This entity was ruled by Kings and Queens until it became a state in 1959. The yellow hibiscus is the state flower, and the capitol is Honolulu. WWII history is shared at Pearl Harbor every day. What state am I?



7. This state is hot, though not humid; its state bird is the cactus wren, and its capitol is Phoenix. It became a state in 1912. Cliff dwellers were once prominent occupants of this entity. What state is this?



8. This Midwestern state was once home to William Clark. Founded in 1821, its capitol is Jefferson City. The bluebird is its state bird, and the Hawthorn its state flower. What is the name of this state?



9. Potatoes grow well in the soil of this state, founded in 1890. The syringa is the state flower and the capitol is Boise. Can you name this agricultural state?



10. Madison is this state's capitol, and the Robin is the state bird. Known as "the Badger State" this state is also known for producing delicious cheese. What state is it?



11. This state was the birthplace of Paducah's General Lloyd Tilghman, and boasts Annapolis as its capitol. The Baltimore Oriole is the state bird. What state is this?



12. Gambling plays a big part in this state's economy, though it is run by strict legal guidelines. It is also number two in mining gold in the US, and number one in mining opals! Which state are we describing?



13. Home to the Mayo Clinic, this state calls St Paul its capitol city. Known as "the Land of 10,000 Lakes" the state is a fisherman's paradise. What state is it?



14. This western state is the least populated of any state in the US. Its capitol is Cheyenne, and the Meadowlark its state bird. What state is this?
